

THE KUCHING RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL (LICENSING OF
MISCELLANEOUS OCCUPATIONS) BY-LAWS

(Made under section 30)

[1st July, 1961]

Citation

1. These By-laws may be cited as the Kuching Rural District Council (Licensing of Miscellaneous Occupations) By-laws.

Interpretation

2. In these by-laws—

“Council” means the Kuching Rural District Council established under the Local Authority (Kuching Rural District Council) Order:

“isolated shop” means any fixed premises on any land expressly alienated for the purpose of trade which is neither a native village shop nor premises alienated for that purpose in a bazaar;

“native village shop” means any fixed premises on Native Customary Land used for the purpose of trade within a native village or kampong or within the *payong rumah* of any longhouse.

Licences in respect of certain trades or businesses

3.—(1) Any person who carries on any of the trades or businesses specified in the First Column of the First Schedule except under and in accordance with the provisions of a licence issued by the Council and at the place, if any, specified in the licence shall be guilty of an offence: Penalty, a fine of fifty dollars for the first offence, and in the case of a second or subsequent offence, a fine of one hundred dollars.

(2) There shall be payable in respect of the licences to carry on the trades and businesses referred to in paragraph (1) the appropriate fees set out in the Second Column of the First Schedule.

Licences to sell alcoholic liquor

4.—(1) Any person who sells alcoholic liquor except under and in accordance with the provisions of a licence issued by the Council and at the place specified in the licence shall be guilty of an offence: Penalty, a fine of one hundred dollars for the first offence, and in the case of a second or subsequent offence, a fine of one hundred and fifty dollars.

(2) There shall be payable in respect of the licences to sell alcoholic liquor specified in the First Column of the Second Schedule the appropriate fees set out in the Second Column of that Schedule.

Period of licences and renewal

5.—(1) Licences may be issued on payment of the appropriate fee and shall—

(a) in the case of a yearly licence, expire on the 31st day of December;

(b) in the case of a quarterly licence, expire on the 31st day of March, the 30th day of June, the 30th day of September or the 31st day of December, whichever first comes after the date of issue; and

(c) in the case of a temporary licence, expire on the date specified therefor in the licence.

(2) Any yearly or quarterly licence renewed within forty-two days of the date of expiry shall be deemed to be renewed with effect from the date of expiry.

LICENCE FEES FOR SALE OF ALCOHOL

First Column <i>Type of Licence</i>	Second Column <i>Per Quarter</i>
"A" (Wholesale)— All alcoholic liquors for consumption off the premises	\$30.00
"B" (Retail)— All alcoholic liquors for consumption off the premises	40.00
"C" (Public House)— All alcoholic liquors for consumption on or off the premises	60.00
"D" (Beers, including all unfortified alcoholic beverages)— For consumption on or off the premises	6.00
"E" (Arrack)— For consumption on or off the premises	15.00
"F" (Social Clubs)— All alcoholic liquors to members of consumption on the premises	4.00
"G" (Approved Charities)— All alcoholic liquors at entertainments in aid of charitable, religious or educational institutions approved by the Council	Free
"H" Occasional Functions)— All alcoholic liquors excluding beer and all unfortified alcoholic beverages, for consumption on the premises specified in the licence	\$100.00 per twelve hours

A licensee who holds both Licence A and Licence C in respect of the same premises shall, in lieu of paying the separate fees therefor specified in the Second Column, pay a combined fee of \$50.00 per quarter.
